Ms. Moody said she is hoping to recruit a number of students, but ideally she would prefer to travel with 6 or 7. The students would buy tour packages through American Educational Travel. This travel company provides the students with travel options at reasonable prices. A group interested in taking a trip to Europe can choose a particular travel package or tailor their own. The time and length of the trip will be up to the students.

The cost of a 8- or 9-day trip ranges from \$1039.00 to \$1399.00, depending on the time of year. All transportation costs, hotel costs, and at least two meals per day are included in the price. A full-time guide who is fluent in the languages of the countries toured will be provided.
