## **History Professor Addresses Summer Graduates**

Methodist College's final summer commencement August 30, was addressed by senior faculty member R. Parker Wilson, who challenged 34 graduates to build upon their liberal arts foundation to live positive lives.

Mr. Wilson told the graduates that their diplomas represent the faculty's best efforts to give them a liberal arts foundation for a lifetime of learning. The history professor described several former faculty members he had know during his 30 years at Methodist and quoted from a popular song recorded by the late Bing Crosby: "Accentuate the positive. Elim-

inate the negative. Latch on to the affirmative. Don't mess with Mr. In-Between."

Later Mr. Wilson brought the house down with a quip he often tosses to new graduates, as they file through a cordon of faculty and staff following commencement. "Go forth and multiply," he said. "Send your children (money) and maybe I'll still be here."

Four students were graduated with honors during Methodist's 19th and final summer commencement. In the future, the college will hold commencement exercises in May and December only.


## **Students Called To Attention**
