The men's soccer team is currently $8-1$ and $3-0$ in the NCAA Division III. The team earned a conference road victory by beating Averett 5-1 on Oct. 5 before losing to Maryville 3-2 in overtime Oct. 6.

Methodist had won 28 of its last 29 games before the Oct. 6 defeat. Maryville, which
