The Founder - The Chapel

Since the time of inception of Saint Augustine's College in 1867, it has dedicated itself to the ethical and moral values of the Protestant Episcopal Church and to the ideals the Church represents to other Americans.

On July 15, 1985, the cornerstone of the Chapel was

laid. The stone for the foundation and the north transept was taken from the grove near the spring on Saint Augustine's grounds. On Christmas Day 1895, the first services were held in the structure and daily services on Quinquagesima Sunday 1896. The north transept was built by students from the masonry class of the College in 1904.

Saint Augustine's College is growing and changing in many ways. However, among the things that have not changed is the college Chapel which stands so majestically in the center of the campus. It stands as an ever present symbol of our faith in God and our commitment to help in bringing His Kingdom on earth.
