

BUILDINGS DEDICATED

Dedicatory services were held Thursday, February 16, 1961, at four o'clock at North Carolina Wesleyan College. Three buildings the Administration, Science, and Classroom Buildings, were dedicated.

Into the cornerstone box were deposited a copy of the charter, the site plan and building plans; a copy of the first Annual Budget of the College; a list of all donors through the Rocky Mount Area Wesleyan College Foundations; the names of all College Trustees and Foundation Directors; the 1956 Journal of the Conference authorizing the establishment of North Carolina Wesleyan College; early newspapers emphasizing organization, support, and establishment of the College; the catalog and early publications of the College, and the roll of all first year students.

The buildings were presented for dedication by Chairman Luther W. Hill. Bishop Paul N. Garber then dedicated the buildings to the service of God and man.

An open house was held in the college afterwards. Ten students were on hand to give guided tours of the buildings. The reception was planned by a special committee headed by Miss Eleanor Krummel, Professor of Languages at the College.

President Thomas Collins dedicated the recently furnished Chapel during the Chapel Service on February 21.
