Each student has been assigned a number which will be kept secret. When a student prepares to hand in his ballot, he will see Jack Price to receive his number, place it in the right hand corner, put the time on the ballot and turn it in to a member of the Committee.

If one name is submitted by two people, the one bearing the most recent time marking will be eliminated. A name picked by the Committee will be presented to the student body to be accepted or rejected. In the case of rejection, a new name will be presented.

The "Ebonons", a fifteen-piece band from Wilson, will provide the music. The theme of the Formal has been kept a secret by the members of the Social Committee and will be revealed to the students only when they enter the building on the night of April 22.

The climax of the evening will be the crowning of a King and a Queen of North Carolina Wesleyan. The boy and girl were voted on by the students on April 10 and the results have been kept a secret by Mrs. Eleanor Wilkinson, adviser to the Social Committee, and the two faculty members who helped to count the ballots. The King and Queen will be crowned at eleven o'clock by Mrs. Wilkinson, President Thomas A. Collins, and Evelyn Harris, Chairman of the Social Committee. The Queen will be presented one and a half dozen long-stem, American Beauty Roses. The King and Queen will reside, nominally, until next spring.
