


## NEW COMMITTEES

## NEW FACULTY

While the workmen outdoors have been busy completing the dorms and Student Union building for next fall and the Admissions Office is working towards the new Freshman Class, the President and Dean have been making additions to the Wesleyan College faculty for next year. At present four additions are positive.

James R. Hailey, a native of Spray, and a candidate for his Ph.D. at Duke University, will serve as assistant professor of Religion next year. Mr. Hailey is a Methodist and his hobbies are fishing, hunting, and watchmaking.
