The appointment of Henry W. Johnson as Instructor of Speech and Drama, Mrs. Ann S. Johnson as Instructor of English and Miss Herta Wollscheiber as Assistant Professor of Physics was recently announced by President Thomas Collins.

Johnson is completing the degree of Master of Arts at the University of North Carolina in Speech and Drama this summer. He was graduated from Duke University with an A.B. degree.

A native of Forest Hills, New York, he has been active in theater, acting, writing and producing drama and musical comedy at Duke and U.N.C.

He will teach public speaking, oral interpretation, drama, and theater next year. He will also establish a drama group and produce one dramatic offering each semester.

Mrs. Johnson was graduated from Duke University with Phi Beta Kappa honors. She earned her Master of Arts from the University of Pennsylvania.

A native of Aiken, S. C., she has taught senior English at Needham Broughton High School in Raleigh.
