

## 39 Students Named On Dean's Lists

Twenty-eight students earned a place on the Dean's List at North Carolina Wesleyan College during the spring semester, according to Dean Moore.

Students attaining Dean's List status must earn a minimum of a 3.20 average, while completing 12 or more semester hours of academic work. Twenty of the above succeeded in attaining the Dean's List in both the first and second semester of the academic year. Only one, Mrs. Felton, was able to sustain a straight A average for the entire year.

Eleven students at North Carolina Wesleyan College achieved a grade average of 3.5 (B+) or above for the summer session. They were named to the Dean's List for their outstanding work.

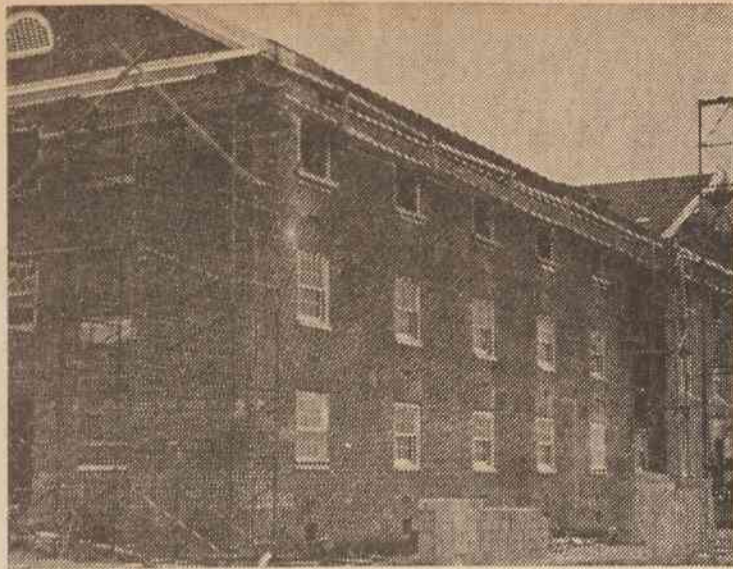

## North Hall Expected To Be Ready Soon

It is rather an understatement to say that Wesleyan is rapidly growing. Two of the most obvious evidences of Wesleyan's structural growth are the new dorms.

Wesleyan's dorms have come quite far in a short time. During its first year, the women's dorm was a converted residence termed Fenner Dorm.

Last year Nash and Edgcombe dorms were sentinels for the "outer limits" of the campus, being at opposite ends of the constructed area.

This year work is being completed on two dorms, one soon to be occupied. South dorm, the new men's dorm is complete, with the exception of landscaping. This houses upper-class men. There is at present space for 16 more occupants, though this will probably soon be filled. Edgcombe dorm is almost full, housing Freshmen men.

North dorm, the new women's dorm will probably be completed by mid-October. This is the estimate of the possible completion date. Climatic conditions have already delayed construction, and it is impossible to tell if future uncontrollable situations will arise.

Nash dorm, the older women's dorm, now houses both upper and lower classmen. The Freshmen are assigned to the first and second floors, with five students in the study

lounge. The third floor is occupied by upper classmen, with five students in the third floor study lounge. Twenty students are temporarily housed in the Infirmary. These will be transferred to North Hall when it is completed.

Mr. Smith stated that he was very grateful for all the wonderful co-operation that students had given to him and all those who are involved in attempting to make students as comfortable as possible under the crowded conditions.

Dr. Cordts in a notice of temporary room assignment to upper classmen stated that the room assignments were only temporary until the new dorm is ready for occupancy. At a later date, the students will be given an opportunity to express a preference for type of accommodation and roommate before assignments are made to the new dormitory.
