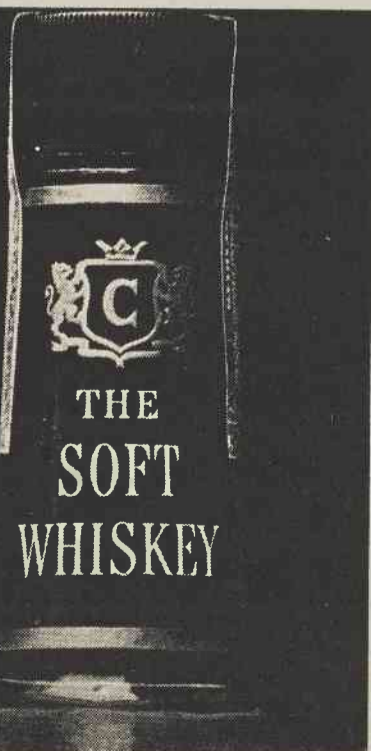
attendance within the upper class who can afford such an exorbitant price.
