In any case, the new restrictive measures are not designed to end a problem by ignoring it, but aredesigned for the benefit of all students as well as those which cannot be accepted at this time. Dean Moore is in agreement with Mr. Garlow's recommendation. He also believes that if this precedent is maintained that the Board of Trustees will become more aware of the acuteness of the problem and will endeavor to give support to the building of an elevator The building funds for the elevator havealready been par tially raised by the S.A.A.B. Students Against Architectural Barriers. About $\$ 5,000$ has been raised; about $\$ 1,000$ more is needed to fulfill the S.A.A.B. portion. It is hoped that the college will raise its portion, $\$ 12,000$ in time for the elevator to be constructed this summer.
