(Continued From Page 2) in convocation two years ago on the topic of race relations -the time of a few days ended this controversy. Yet with ride Wesleyan students talk of the Uyward Bound Programand the achievements of Wesleyan in his area.

The ego of Wesleyan could use a ittle inflation--not to destroy as a nationalsitic or facist ego might do, but rather an ego that will make Wesleyan not just a community of students bikering over Rocky Mount but a concerned group of people involved America and the World.
