Pi Epsilon arose to fulfill

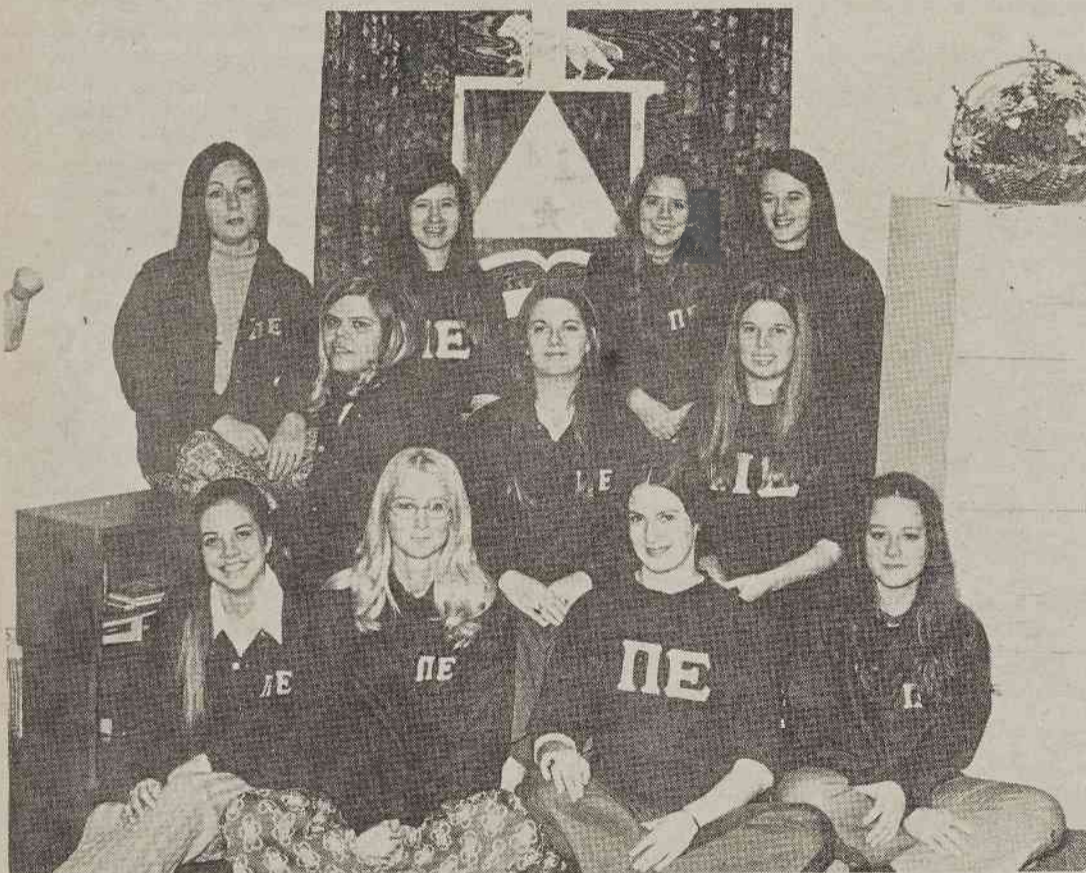
certain needs lacking in other organizations on campus. And today, it has been able, not only to meet the needs of her sis-
