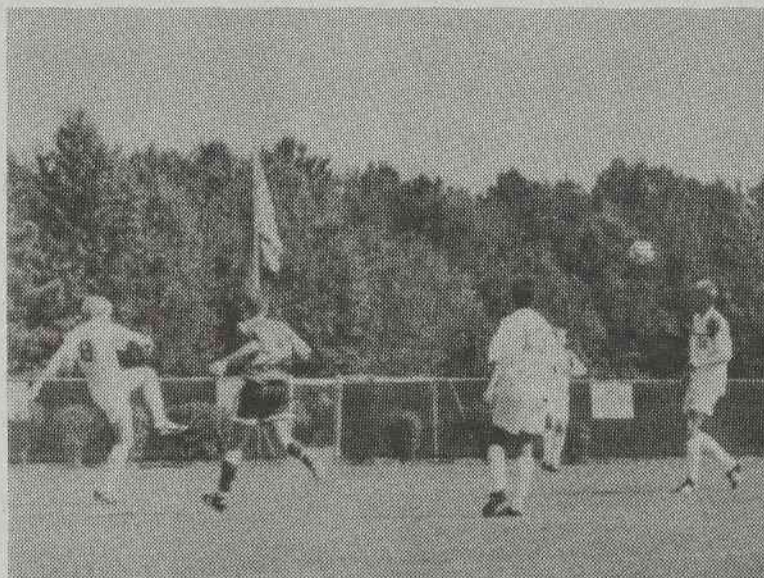

Depending on how things go, Calhoun might just take anyone who is interested. On Sept. 16, a lot of people attended an interest meeting.

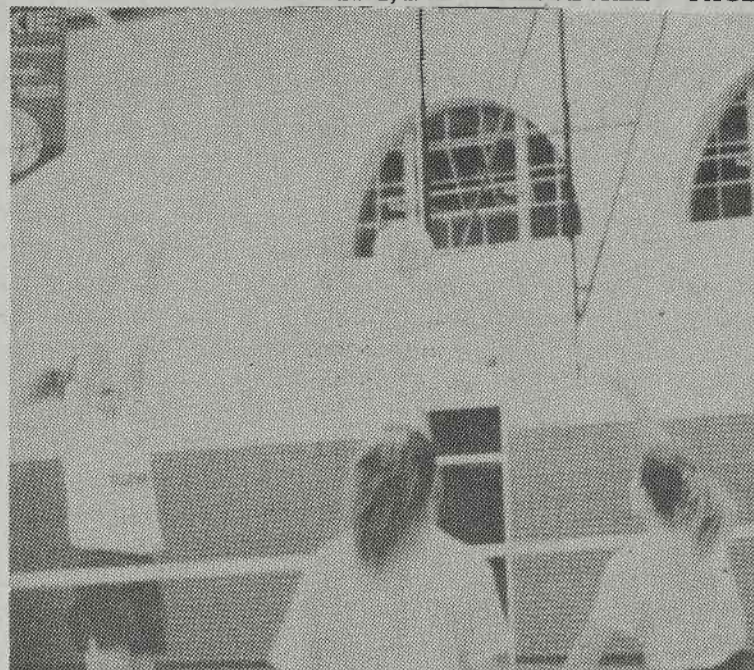
The team won't be traveling to away games but will attend all of the home games. Calhoun is not sure if the squad will be in any competitions this year.
