Comedian Troy Thirdgill received a warm welcome on Feb. 9 as more than 60 students, professors, and staff overflowed the seats in Doc's.


The event was sponsored by Campus Activities Board and Phi Beta Lambda.


Group study areas are supervised as well. Each group should maintain a reasonably quiet atmosphere to respect others who need quiet study, abiding by posted rules.
