day and Wednesday from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and 4:30-6 p.m. each day. Registered candidates for SGA President are Davon Davis, Pamela Foreman, and Abdoulaye Foola. John Hopkins is candidate for SGA Treasurer.

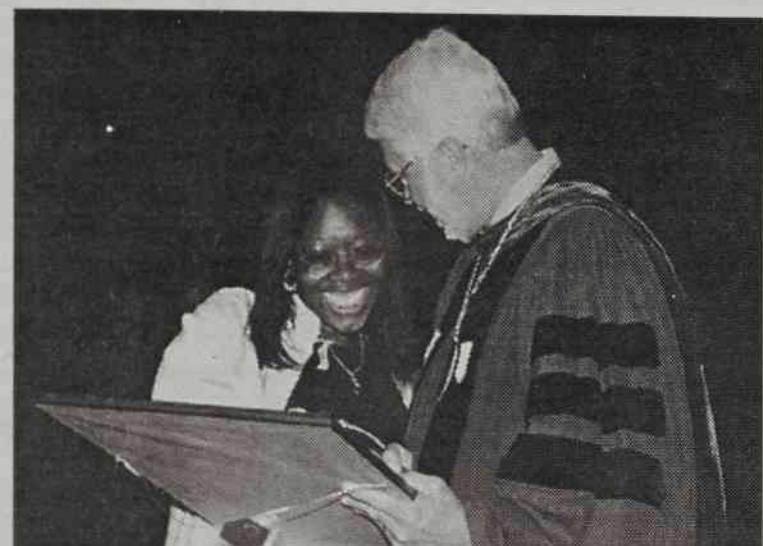

by vote of their class members. Write-in candidates are allowed. Elections will be based on a plurality vote of the student body. All students are asked to respect the campaign materials of all candidates and not tear down, deface, or destroy these materials.
