

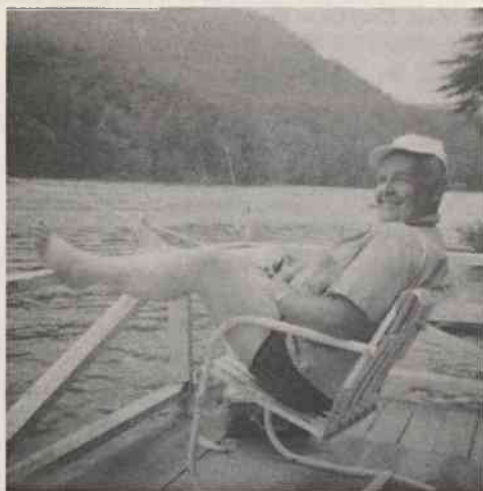
Rusaline Briles spent her vacation at Myrtle Beach.
