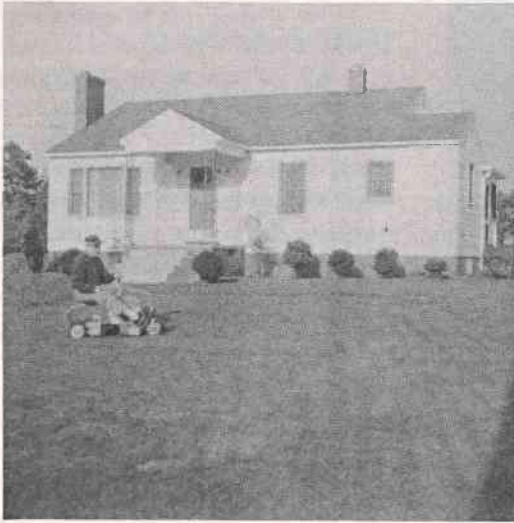


HOME OF THE MONTH
