

**CLYDE W. BRILES
DIES UNEXPECTEDLY**



Clyde W. Briles, manager of the Production Control Department of the Main Office, died October 7, 1961.

He was born in High Point on January 21, 1908, and had spent his entire life here. He attended High Point city schools and the University of North Carolina. He was a veteran of World War II, having served in the Air Corps.
