After twenty-five years of service with Adams-Millis Corporation, Mrs. Beatrice Hastings retired April 5, 1962, on the basis of age. Coley left the company in November of 1941 to go into defense work for the duration of World War II; however, he returned in September of 1948 and worked until June of last year when his health became too poor for him to continue.

Baptist Church of Kernersville. He and Mrs. Coley, who is a former employee of Adams-Millis, reside at 162 Baxter Street in Kernersville.

Walter L. Tate retired April 27, 1962, on the basis of total and permanent disability. Walter's health has failed continuously since 1957, with his ability to work being limited, thereby necessitating his retirement.
