### **KEEP BENEFICIARY NAMED FOR YOUR INSURANCE**

Do you know who would get your insurance and profit sharing funds if you should die? Are you sure you have the beneficiary forms made out to the one you want to receive the benefits? Has there been a change since you named the beneficiaries?

The beneficiary designations you sign for your insurance and profit sharing have the same legal power as a will. If the person you have named to receive those funds has died, or there have been other changes, you should ask your foreman for another form so you can make a new designation.
