HOSIERY PLANTS RECEIVE ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS



SAFETY CERTIFICATES

The machine shop, main office and the Mt. Airy plant operated the year of 1972 without a lost-time accident. Plant 7 was cited for having made a significant reduction in accident frequency for the year.

Commissioner Creel also presented the Certificate of Safety Achievement to the Haw River plant of the Fabrics Division for working the year 1972 without a lost-time injury.

According to Commissioner Creel, North Carolina has a comparatively low Disabling Injury Frequency Rate (8.2 lost-time accidents Per million man-hours), compared with the much higher national rate (15.4 lost-time accidents per million man-hours). The 1972 rate for all divisions of Adams-Millis was 8.3. The Hosiery Division had the lowest rate with the frequency of 5.0
