MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

TO MY FELLOW WORKERS:

National Memorial Day comes soon. Throughout the land people will bow their heads in tribute to those who have fallen in their country's service, and in thanksgiving for the national heritage which such sacrifices have preserved.

This is the day when, in public ceremonies, with floral memorials on graves, and in private family observances, the nation outwardly gives evidence of its inner spirit of patriotism. And it is well that we are so solemnly reminded of our debt to those who have passed in order that we continue conscious of our obligations in the future.

Today we inherit the power and security for which courageous patriots have fought from the revolutionary days of Lexington to the battles of Korea. New Safety Inspectors Begin Duties . . .

The new group of safety inspectors who will serve for the next four months attended their first safety meeting last week when Aline Carter outlined for them their duties.

Also Aline commended the retiring committee and observed that obviously their work had been done well as only five departments failed to achieve a

grade of 100 in the last inspection. These included the Blue and Red Teams at Independence, Shipping, Sales Division Office, Sherrod Cutting and Pattern.

The safety program was started at Anvil Brand in 1951, Aline recalled, and said that it is through the efforts of the committees which serve voluntarily that the marked improvement in

safety has been achieved in the plants.

The committees, she said, serve as a clearing house for suggestions and improvements and that the persons who serve on the committee are selected by the supervisors.
