ship throughout the Southeast area with a concentration in the Carolinas and Virginia. Some 75 high schools in North Carolina are affiliated.

SSPA was founded four years ago at North Carolina College for the purpose of improving scholastic publications. It offers continuing services to high school newspapers and yearbooks and to teachers and students interested in journalism.

The leading activity is its annual spring conference-workshop which will be held at NCC in April, 1961.

SSPA offers a critical service for high school publications, giving its members a by-the-issue evaluation of each newspaper and yearbook. It also sponsors an annual competition for publications with awards for excellence contributed by national and local newspapers and publishing concerns.

The organization also publishes "Presstime," a magazine containing helpful information for high school newspaper and yearbook advisers and staff members.

phasized the voluntary nature of the Code, pointing out that officials at both schools were were eager to improve athletic relations.

Under terms of the new document, pre-game visits to the campus of respective schools "for the purpose of defacing or or destroying college property" are discouraged. In addition, on-the-field meetings between players following the game are forbidden.

Both offences as well as numerous others dealing with the behavior of coaches, players, students, alumni booster groups and spectators will result in stiff penalties.
