

## NCC Cagers Slate 21 Games

North Carolina College's basketball team will play a 21-game slate, according to a schedule released by Athletic Director J. W. Younge here recently. The Eagles open their rigorous schedule with Virginia State College's Trojans December 3 in Durham.

In addition to the twenty regular Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association contests, NCC will play in the Holiday Festival Tournament, Winston-Salem, and lock horns with the rugged Camp LeJeune Marines

in three contests.

Having lost Captain Hubie Williamson and "Pete" Jones from last year's aggregation, which posted a 14-11 record, NCC boasts of eight returning lettermen and a couple of sturdy freshmen.

ed, "in being a liberal arts institution, and I want to go on record here as saying that even though I have been educated as a scientist, I hope I am a totally educated man; that I believe in the value of the humanities, the value of the social sciences, and the value of all of the arts and sciences; that unless a man is educated broadly, he really doesn't have much of an education," he said.

Dr. Massie holds degrees from Ark. A. & M. College, Fisk University and Iowa State University," he said.

Continuing, he discussed further his beliefs:—In the assumption of responsibility by all who work in an institution;

—In respect for oneself, his students, and laws and traditions of the community and the college;

—In a moral integrity which dictates that one follow certain accepted codes of personal behavior in his relationships with others;

—In work, in which the faculty member and the student work to the full extent of their capacities. "I believe that man is made to work, and that he's happiest when he is working," he asserted.

Concluding, he paraphrased a state highway marker at the Virginia border citing North Carolina as a good place to work, play, live, and serve.

"This is my wish for North Carolina College—that it be a good place to learn, work, play, live, and serve," he said.

La. He played high school football under Russell Blount, now football coach at Durham's Hillside High School.

He was an outstanding performer in football and track at Saint Augustine's from 1949 to 1950, serving as co-captain of the football team and earning all-conference recognition as a center in 1949.

Later, as a member of the U. S. Army, he played end on service teams. He was recipient of the Purple Heart, the Silver Star, and the Bronze Star for action in Korea.

He received his B.A. degree from Saint Augustine's College, and his M.A. degree from Columbia University and has studied further at Indiana University.

Before entering college ranks, Quiett worked on the high school level, coaching two championship teams in Georgia and

one undefeated team in Florida, compiling an overall six-year record of 46-13-4. His record at Saint Augustine's was 8-9-1.

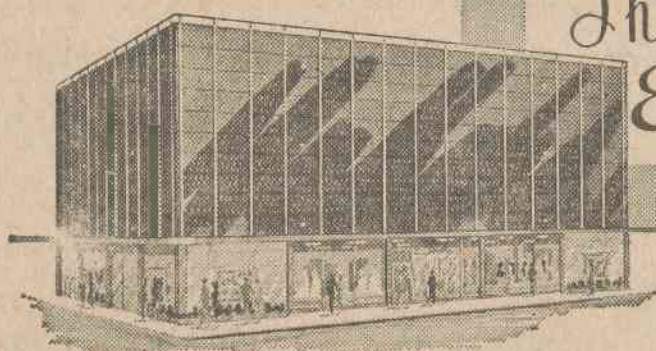
