President of the Southern Regional Educational Board to Speak

NCCU GRADUATION SET FOR MAY 18TH

Winfred L. Godwin, president of the Southern Regional Education Board, will be the Commencement speaker at North Carolina Central University, Sunday, May 18.

Dr. Godwin's organization, which he has headed since 1961, provides technical assistance and financial support to NCCU programs in nursing and in the sciences. The SREB administers funds provided by the W.R. Kenan Trust to support curriculum innovation and improvement of teaching methods. That

program has given NCCU \$75,000 each year for nine years to support the development of various academic programs.

Godwin will speak at the Commencement Exercises at 9 a.m., Sunday, May 18, at NCCU's O'Kelly Stadium. The University is expected to award between 900 and 1,000 degrees to undergraduate, graduate and professional students.

The speaker is a native of Montgomery, Alabama, a summa cum laude graduate of Birmingham - Southern College,

and the holder of M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he was a student of the celebrated regional sociologists Howard Odum and Rupert Vance.

He joined the SREB in 1953, after serving as Survey Director of the Jefferson County (Ala.) Coordinating Council.

Programs developed by the SREB during Dr. Godwin's presidency include an Academic Common Market through which Southern states share uncommon graduate programs; a con-

tinuing program to inform political leaders of issues and problems confronting higher education; a consultation service to assist states in the strengthening of planning in post-secondary education; and a number of efforts to expand curricula in the health and human services fields and to improve teaching at the undergraduate level.

During the period of Dr. Godwin's presidency, the SREB has emphasized the expansion of educational opportunities for students and the creation of an infor-

mation clearinghouse at SREB for comparative higher education statistics.

Dr. Godwin has been active in advisory panels and boards for such organizations as the Ford and Carnegie foundations, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the American Council on Education, and the American Association for Higher Education. Since its founding in 1969 he has served as Chairman of the Board of Change Magazine, a higher education monthly.

Honors Program To Organize College Bowl For Fall '80

The College Bowl is a nationwide competition between teams from different colleges and universities from across the country. It is a game between two teams who respond quickly and accurately to questions that range from topics of current events to mathematics. The teams are composed of four players and an optional alternate player who can be substituted for another player during the game.

Currently, the University Honors Program and the Elder Student Union are trying to form a College Bowl competition at NCCU in the fall. Different teams composed of NCCU students will compete against each other. From this competition, a single team will be formed to represent NCCU at the state, regional, and national competitions.

The grand prize for the winning team of the national championships is \$25,000

in scholarship money and a trip to England to compete against the winning British team.
