Registrar explains current, proposed system

"Effective but still not sufficient." That's how Dr. Bernell Jones, NCCU's registrar, describes the school's registration process.

Jones, formerly regsistar at Winston-Salem State University from 1975-1978 and director of Personnel Training and Development from 1978-1982, has been registrar at NCCU for two years.

Jones noted that all the departments must work together to insure a smooth registration process in cooperation with the Registrar's office, Financial Aid, Data Processing, the Athletic office and the Office of the Bursar.

"If one of these offices breaks down, then the entire registration process fails," said Jones.

One way to avoid problems is for students to complete their pre-registration forms early, making sure all courses and section numbers are coded in correctly.

A second important step is NCCU's course catalog. to complete all financial aid forms as soon as possible. "If cerning the whereabouts of this is done, students can go this year's catalog. through registration smoother and faster," he said.
