The delay, according to station manager Donald Baker, can be attrib-

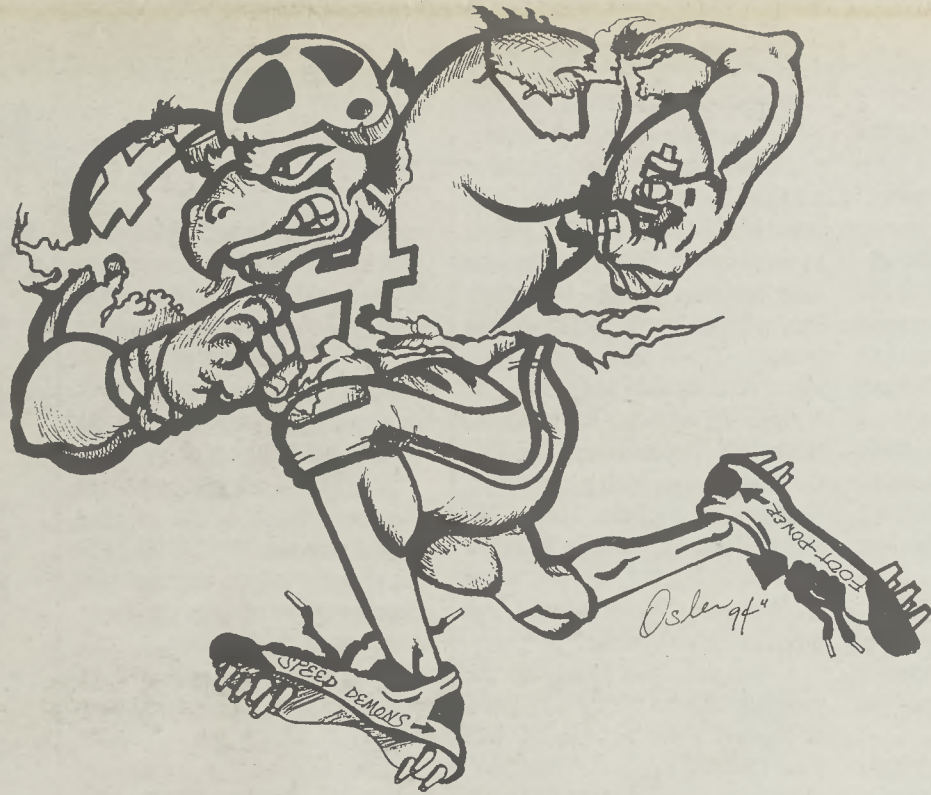
