

"What Goes On"

An information service unique to the Southeast is being launched at Duke Medical Center for physicians in North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia. The service will feature a monthly booklet, entitled "What Goes On," which will list all medical meetings, special lectures, post graduate courses and other events of interest in the three-state area. Distribution will be free to practicing physicians and medical faculty members.

Dr. William M. Nicholson, director of postgraduate medical education at the Duke University Medical Center, said the booklet will be prepared by the Center, in cooperation with medical societies and schools in all three states. Financial sponsorship will come from the Lederle Laboratories Division of the American Cyanamid Co. at Pearl River, N. Y.
