## **Auxiliary Projects**

Purchase of an Aquamatic Thermal Unit will make it possible to eliminate this cumbersome, ice-packed bed. The new unit is a plastic sheet through which water can be circulated. The sheet can be wrapped around the patient, and the temperature of the water regulated to raise or lower the patient's body temperature.
