## Nelson Given Medical Center Information Post

Appointment of Norman K. Nelson to the newly created post of Public Information Officer for the Duke Medical Center is the first step in a long-range program designed to provide more comprehensive information services for the entire University. Mr. Nelson's promotion from post of assistant director of the Bureau of Public Information to his present assignment means that he will devote his full time to the handling of Medical Center information for mass communication media: news and feature stories, radio and television material. Although responsible for Medical Center news for the past five years, he has also had to divide his time with other responsibilities.

Mr. Nelson, a 1948 graduate of Duke (A.M., 1949), joined the Bureau of Public Information twelve years ago. He was made assistant director in 1952, and was assigned in 1956 to handle medical writing. He is a member of the National Association of Science Writers.

### WEDDING BELLS

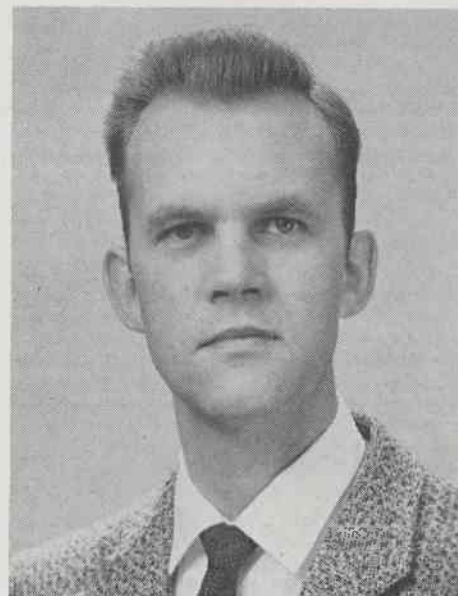
