

11 Medical Center Employees Elected

New Representatives Will Convene Soon

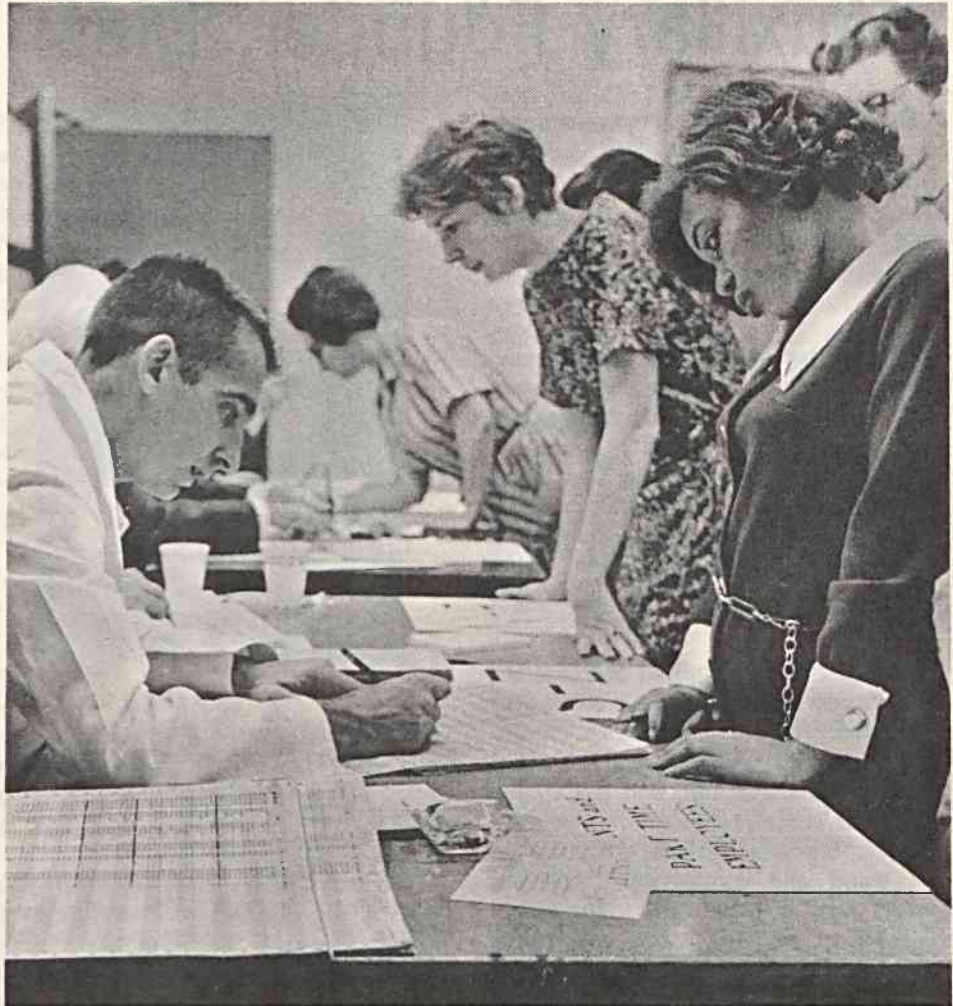

The council, a result of meetings last spring and summer among the administration, faculty, students and employees, will serve as a medium for discussion and resolution of employe problems. The group will concern itself with the areas of wage scales, hiring, seniority, terminations, promotions, the grievance procedure and other job-related topics.

After the first meeting of the council, the permanent Duke University Employee Relations Advisory Committee will be established. DUERAC will review matters of disagreement between the administration and the Employees' Council. The committee will make recommendations when necessary. These recommendations become effective unless they are vetoed in writing by the president of the University within 30 days.

DUERAC will consist of five members, two chosen by the Employees' Council, two by the University administration and one by mutual agreement.
