## Wins Award

Dr. Yihong Kong, assistant professor of medicine, has won first prize in the Young Investigators' Award competition at the 19th annual scientific sessions of the American College of Cardiology in New Orleans February 26.

Dr. Kong's paper was titled "Assessment of Regional Myocardial Performance from Biplane Coronary Cineangiograms."
