## Gives Talks

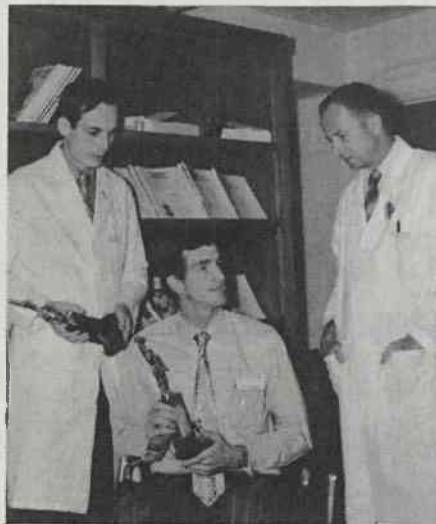
