Nursing School Names New Academic Programs Director

Dr. Ada F. Most has recently been appointed director of academic programs and associate professor in the School of Nursing.

Born in Vienna, Austria, Dr. Most spent her childhood in Jerusalem where she obtained a diploma from the Henrieta Szold - Hadassah School of Nursing in 1956.

From 1958 to 1969 she attended Columbia University Teachers College and received her B.S., M.A., Ed.M. and Ed.D. degrees. While in New York completing her degrees, she was an instructor at the Englewood Hospital School of Nursing in New Jersey and St. Luke's Hospital School of Nursing in New York City.

Prior to her arrival at Duke, Dr. Most was an associate professor at the

University of Texas School of Nursing in Austin.

In her new position at the School of Nursing, Dr. Most's responsibilities will be enlarged to include the development of programs other than the current ones on the undergraduate level. She will also assume overall responsibility for the implementation and evaluation of the recently revised undergraduate curriculum and assist faculty in exploring the possible development of graduate and continuing education programs.

Aside from her new responsibilities, Dr. Most enjoys folk dancing and square dancing, she plays the piano and accordion, and is fluent in Hebrew and German. She has two children who will be attending school in Durham. Her husband is an assistant professor at the University of Texas School of Engineering in Austin.
