

Historan **Published**

James Clifton, history professor at Southeastern Community College has recently published a reserch paper, "A Half-Century of a Georgia Rice Plantation" in the NORTH CAROLINA HISTORICAL REVIEW.

The article is centered around rice planting by Charles Manigaults who was perhaps the wealthiest of rice planters in South Carolina. Clifton began his research in the summer of 1968 at Duke University and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He also worked at the Charleston, South Carolina, Historical Society and the Rice Museum at Georgetown, South Carolina,
