LOUNGE LAZY Mickey Nobles, who knows every broken chair, scratched table, and inch of tile around.

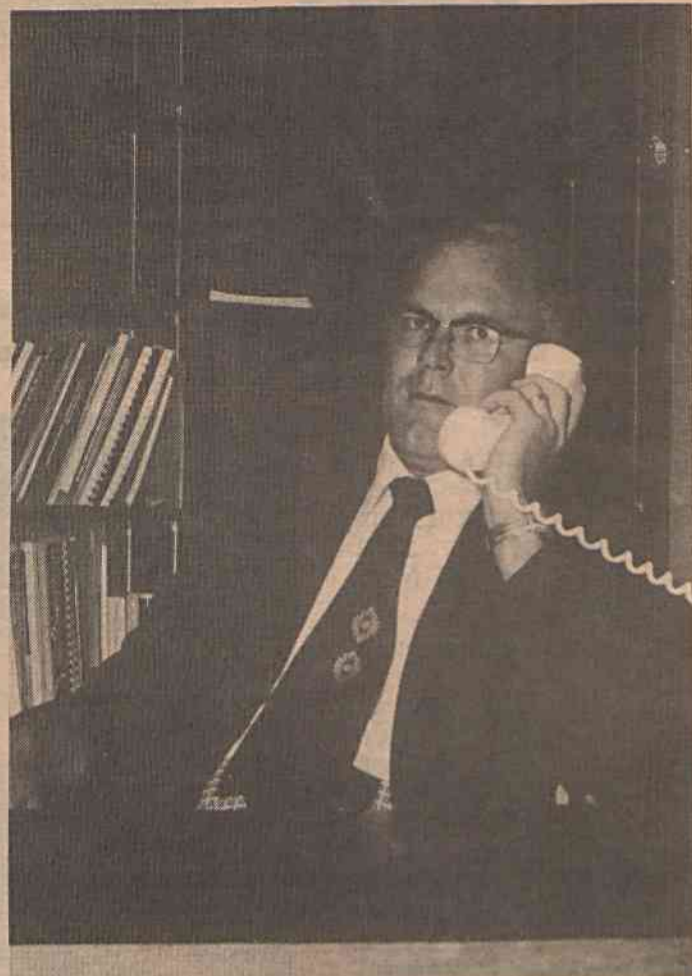
