THE 1910-'11 FACULTY.

The next session of the college opens September 7, 1910. The Trustees announced the following changes in the Faculty: Dr. E. E. Randolph, Prof. J. T. Cobb, Miss Pitt, of the Music Department, and Miss Urquhart, of the Department of Expression, retire upon their own motion. Mr. S. G. Rollings was elected Professor of History and Social Science. Mr. W. F. Warren was elected an instructor in the Preparatory Department, and Miss Ethel Clements to the position of teacher of Expression and Physical Culture.

Rev. W. T. Herndon resigned as a member of the Board of Trustees, and Mr. C. A. Shoop, of Suffolk, Va., was elected in his stead.
