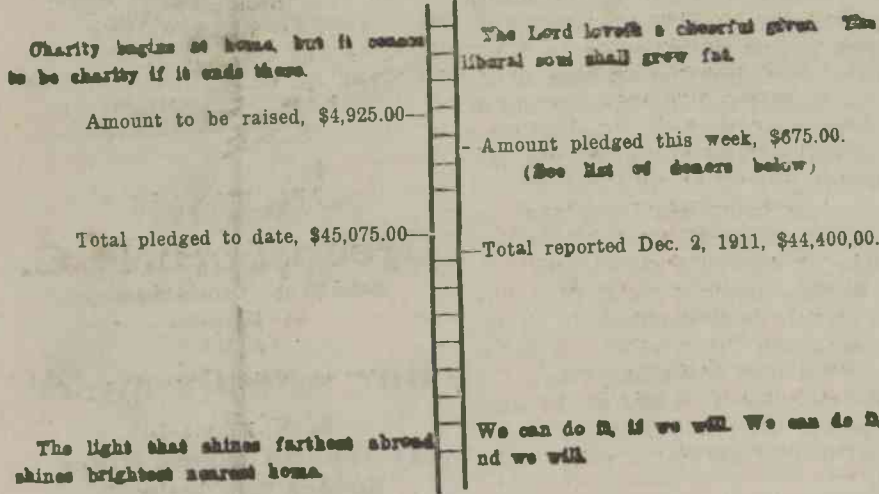


Special Fund. \$50,000 Elon College.

To Clean the College of Debt—A Challenge to the Liberality and Loyalty of our Brotherhood.

Six years ago by order of the Southern Christian Convention, the Board of Trustees of the College borrowed \$47,700 with which to build a new dormitory for girls and install a steam heat, electric light and water plant for the College. These improvements were absolutely necessary to the life and development of the College, and now it is equally necessary that the money to pay this debt be raised before the bonds by which it is secured fall due in 1918. It is a challenge to the heroic, to the loyal, and the liberal spirit of our Brotherhood to do this great thing. Our people are moved in this direction as never before and are determined, by the grace of God, to clear the institution they love of debt and to enlarge the sphere of its usefulness and power. In this endeavor President Harper is now in the field and is meeting with much encouragement. The College Weekly will carry each week from now on a list of contributors to this fund. The plan as outlined at the Suffolk Convention is to get the friends to subscribe so much a year for five years, thus making the raising of the sum easy and a response within the reach of all. No worthier cause than this ever offered itself to a large-hearted and generous people, and the money given to this end will do good for ages and ages to come.
