'Mohammed was a completely changed man. Instead of the gentle, pious soul, he became a cruel monster. Instead of the 'Faithful' he became the crimu. nal. No longer did he adhere to one wanted. He was guilty of every crime in the decalogue.
He became the virtual governor of Madina and used the people to forward is vile purposes. The last eleven years of the prophet's life were years of unspeakable crimes and cruelties. He died at the comparatively early ace He sixty two in year six hundred hirty yo. he was succeeded by his father-in-law, Adubica
