on commencement occasions will be able to be accommodated. Governor Trinkle will be introduced by Governor Cameron Morrison.

The baccalaureate address, which is customary to be given on Sunday evening of the commencement season will be omitted this year by vote of the faculty.

Rev. Stanley C. Harrell, of the Class of 1909, will give the Alumni oration on Monday evening at 8:00 o'clock, and on Tuesday evening, the final event of the commencement, two pageants which have been woven into a single program will be given under the leadership of Prof. W. F. Greenwood. These pageants are entitled "Columbus" and "Three Centuries of American Democracy."

One of the real features of the commencement will be the laying of the corner stone of the Alamance Building. Col. R. L. Holt of this county will preside, and Hon. E. S. Parker will deliver the oration for this occasion. Dr. Opie, of Burlington, will also have part in the program. The corner stone for this building will carry the inscription, "Donated by the citizens of Alamance County."
