Crutchfield pitched for Elon and made a very creditable showing. After the first two or three innings the visitors got on to "Tobe's" delivery and hit consistently until the eighth frame, when Fogleman took the mound.

Although the score of each team played tag with the score of the other team the outcome never really seemed in doubt. The game was raggedly played and many errors by both teams marred the contest throughout. Both teams hit with frequency and several trotted off the entire circuit on long hits and errors.

WAKE FOREST GAME

The Deamon Deacons, outfit four to one by the scrappy Christian bunch, but playing invincible ball in the pinches, defeated Elon 3 to 1, on Gore Field Tuesday afternoon. The big show of the game was the 12 cylinder hurling of Fowler for the visitors. With an easy slow ball movement Fowler retired the team that yesterday cashed in on

State's best for 15 hits, with two safeties, one of them a measly scratch.

Wake Forest started the game in snappy fashion in the opening frame by scoring two runs and giving the affair all the earmarks of a walk-away. Tim berlake was passed. Small hit and Tim berlake came home. Armstrong sacrificed to give Small the other run. Elon came back strong in the second, however, and held Wake Forest for three outs. Only once more during the game were Garrity's charges able to count. Elon scored in the fifth when F. Caddell walked and P. Caddell tripled to right field. Portsider Kid Kitchin pitched a creditable game for Wake Forest especially in the pinches. In the second inning after Gilliam and Crutchfield had singled with nobody out he settled down and fanned the next batters in one, two, three order. He sent 11 men back to the bench via the air route.

Slaughter in centerfield for Elon showed that he had the right name so far as opposing pitchers are concerned, for he collected two nice hits from Kitchin's offerings. Gilliam, first base, also made two singles. Rightfielder Small was the only man on the Baptist squad to get a clean hit.
