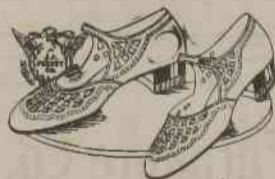

 Building.

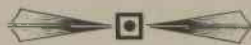
And there is a still more convenient

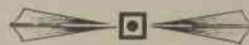
