"PEA-HEAD", WALKER CHOSEN COACH OF MAJOR SPORTS

qualifies him to take over the teams of the Fighting Christians, and his coming as coach here is expected to materially improve the Elon teams, especially in football and basketball.

In college athletics Coach Walker has been an outstanding player at Howard

College, Birmingham, and at Vanderbilt University, where he participated for four years in the sports. He filled the position of quarterback in football, forward and guard in basketball and shortstop in baseball. For two years he was selected as all-state quarterback and all-state shortstop, and was awarded a cup as the best all-round athlete at Howard College. At Vanderbilt University he played quarterback on the football team under the famous southern coach, Dan McGuigin.

In addition to his college athletic playing record Coach Walker has been in professional baseball for six seasons, four years with Wilson Bugs of the Virginia league, one year with the Rochester club of the International league, which team was managed by George Stallings who piloted the Boston Braves to a world's championship in 1914, and one season with the Norfolk club also in the Virginia league.

His coaching experience consists of seven years of successful work in high school and college sports, which include the Roanoke, West Point, and Columbia high schools in Alabama, and Howard College and Atlantic Christian College. In all his coaching work he has had charge of all three major sports and has been equally successful in them all.
