## The Christians Defeated Catawba Indians 7-1 In A Slow Game

With the court tennis and racquet season drawing near very few of the students know of Elon's prospects. For several weeks now the men have been going through a series of elimination matches to decide as to the personnel of the three doubles teams which will form the varsity squad. So far there has not been any elimination contest to determine the three representatives in the singles, but Coach Regan will likely select these men from the winners of the doubles.

With the elimination tournament about over we are safe in saying that the team composed of Rountree and "Puny" Hinton looks best. Hinton has the height and drive to look good on the service, while Rountree covers the net in a very creditable manner. The runners up would probably be the "Flip" Hunter and "Red" Jones team. Although woefully out of practice we would be safe in saying that they will improve in proportion to their practice. Both have oceans of natural ability but seem to be disinclined to over exertion. The third place on the squad is still undetermined, and lies between the team of Whitley and Newman and Loessie and Hamrick. The former pair look good although Newman seems to have an uncontrollable desire to over-use the "cut." The latter pair have the edge if Loessie can ever get over his attack of spring fever.

The Christians started their bombardment in the third when Smith got on by a fielder's choice. Harrington followed with a two bagger and Briggs followed with a three-base hit, later scoring on Sims' sacrifice.

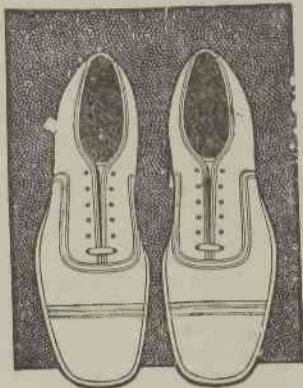
