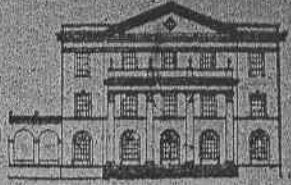

### Double Steal Means Defeat For Carolina The Holidays

Griffith Holds Christians to Three Hits; U. N. C. Gets 10.

#### LINDLEY STEALS HOME FOR TALLY

A U. N. C. hurler named Joe Griffin turned in an astounding performance Saturday against the Christian rine of Elon when he limited the opposition to three hits, but a double steal that sent Lindley, Elon leftfielder across the plate, made his good work all for naught when the game ended 1-0.

The Tar Heel's big right-hander did his stuff brilliantly and his teammates held up the willow work end by lamming out 10 hits, but so battered were the bingles that none of the invaders proved able to transform them into a bingle and left the field under a thin coat of whitewash. Lindley's steal was engineered by Cheek with a burn supplying the motive power.

Peacock, with a trio of singles, led the batting attack of the Tar Heels, whose hitting ability fell just short of a concerted attack of Waters in the pinches, when a succession of hits might have scored. Oroom was second to Peacock, lamming out a pair of safeties. Two of Elon's hits were chalked to the credit of the stellar first baseman, Cheek. The Christians ran wild over the bases, stealing five in all, and Lindley and Cheek snagged a pair each of there.
