FRATERNITY OUTFIT GOES THROUGH FIRST HALF UNDEFEATED

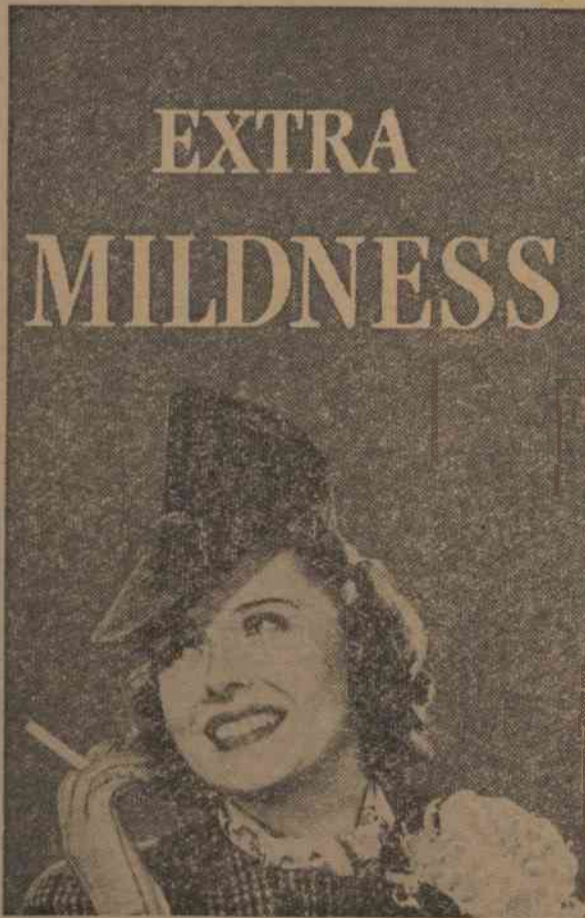

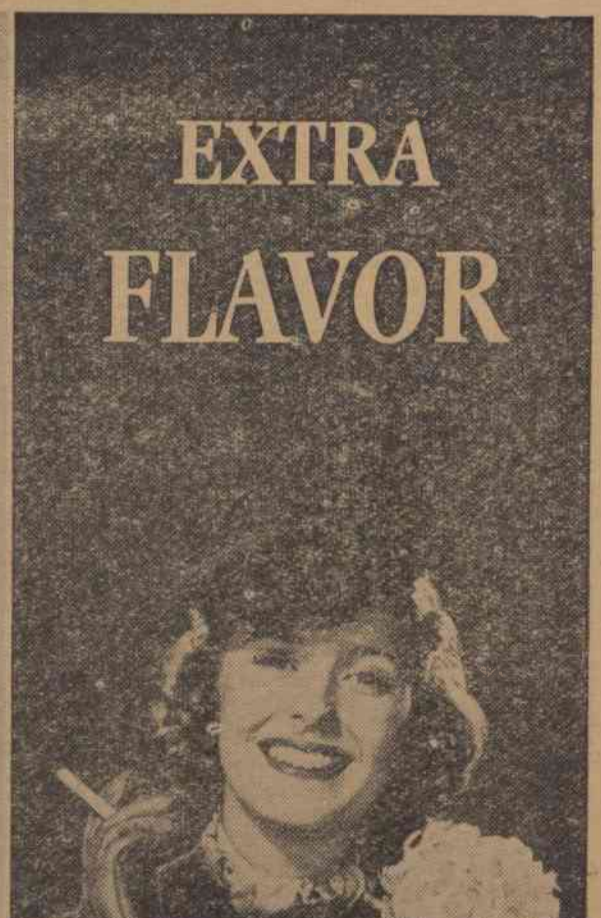
