(Continued from Page 1) dresses of welcome and the rules of the assembly, they convened in their separate sessions and adjournment came at six o'clock, after three hours of heated discussion, that, according to the News and Observer, was not an imitation but a faithful reproduction of the General Assembly. Indeed it was; the delegates squirmed and chatted when the debate was dull, and fifteen or twenty furiously shouted for the floor at the end of a provocative speech. All in all, it was fun, furious and interesting.

The 'Senators' were entertained at a banquet at Edenton Street Methodist church Friday night a eight and the delegates reconvened immediately after, for another three hour session.

Governor Hoey, Governor-Nominate Broughton and Secretary of State, Thad Eure, addressed a joint session of the assembly on Saturday morning. Each of the speakers praised the young legislators for their interest in law-making and told them to keep up their interest and develop into capable leaders of tomorrow.

A half-hour broadcast over W. P. T. F. Saturday morning followed the Addresses by Governor Hoey. This broadcast was from the Senate and at the time of the broadcast a bill on national defense was being discussed.

Final adjournment came at one on Saturday, after completion of all the legislation on the calendar. Our six Elon Congressmen: Louis Adair, Henry Wise, A. D.
