### KEEP 'EM FLYING

Complete physical and mental tests given by Aviation Cadet Examining Board, Room 216 Post Office Building, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, for Aviation Cadet candidates, U. S. Army.

Any young man between the ages of 18 and 26 (both inclusive) married or single are eligible.

The examination is of the short-answer, multiple-type choice. A well read, intelligent man should have little difficulty in passing this examination. Formal schooling is not a prerequisite.

Upon successful completion of Aviation Cadet training, cadets are commissioned Second Lieutenants Air Corps Reserve and assigned to duty with the Army Air forces.

While undergoing training, the pay of Aviation Cadets is \$75.00 per month with an additional \$1.00 per day for subsistence and while undergoing training, they will furnish quarters, medical care, hospitalization, uniforms, clothing, equipment and \$10,000 Government Insurance, all at Government expense.

The pay for Second Lieutenants Air Corps ranges from \$205 per month to \$245 per month.

The types of cadet training include Pilot, Navigator, and Bombardier, all leading to commissions as Second Lieutenants Army Air Corps.

The following papers are required for all applicants:

1. Application blanks in triplicate (to be notarized).
2. Three letters of recommendation from reputable citizens.
3. Copy of Birth Certificate.
4. If married, statement that dependents are self-supporting.
5. 18 to 21 years of age, parents' consent (notarized).
