HOWARD CATES GIVES GRADUATION RECITAL

J. Howard Cates appeared in a graduation recital in voice Monday evening at Elon College. It was a recital which betrayed an unusual musicianship, good command of the voice, and was a pleasure to listen to from start to finish.

Mr. Cates' diction was carefully handled, his sense of intonation impeccable, and his style showed maturity seldom found on a student recital. He reached the acme of his dramatic ability in "Vision Fugitive from Herodiade" by Massenet in which the upper register of the singer's voice was particularly satisfying—resonant and full at all times.

Other numbers on the program were "Vittoria Mi Core" (Carissimi), "Ombra Mai fu" (Handel), "La Belle Table est mise," "Plaisir d'Amour" (Martini), "Apres un Reve" (Faure), three songs by Schubert, "Blow, Blow, Thou Winter Wind" (Arne) "The Pretty Creature" (Wilson), "Trade Winds" (Keel) and "Mother Cary" (Keel). Encores were "Water Boy" and "Short-in' Bread."

Mr. Cates was ably accompanied by Lila Le Van, instructor in piano at Elon College, who played with great discretion and musical understanding.
